

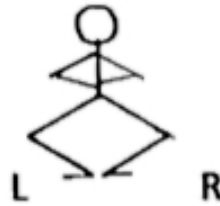

The 3rd and 8th Thattadavus are set in Rubaha thalam, the rest are set in Adi thalam.










There are 8 types of Nattadavus, all the Nattadavus are set in Adi Thalam. This is the first step we learn with hand Hastas.










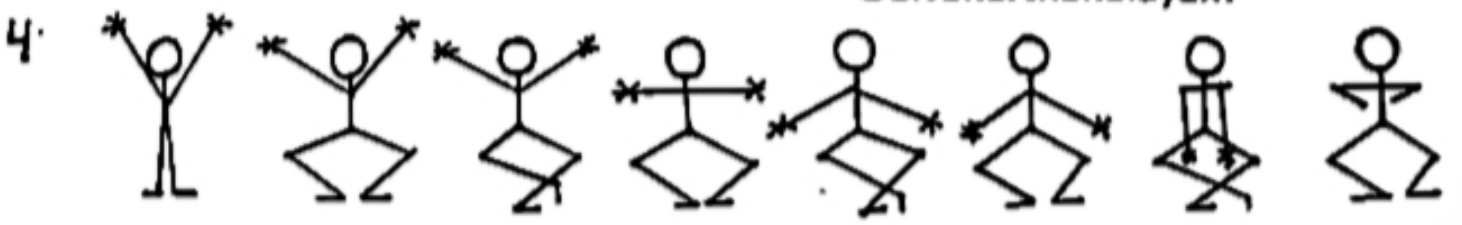
Paraval Adavu

There are 4 variations of Tha Thei Theitha Adavus, they are all set in Adi thalam. It's also called Visharu Adavu.



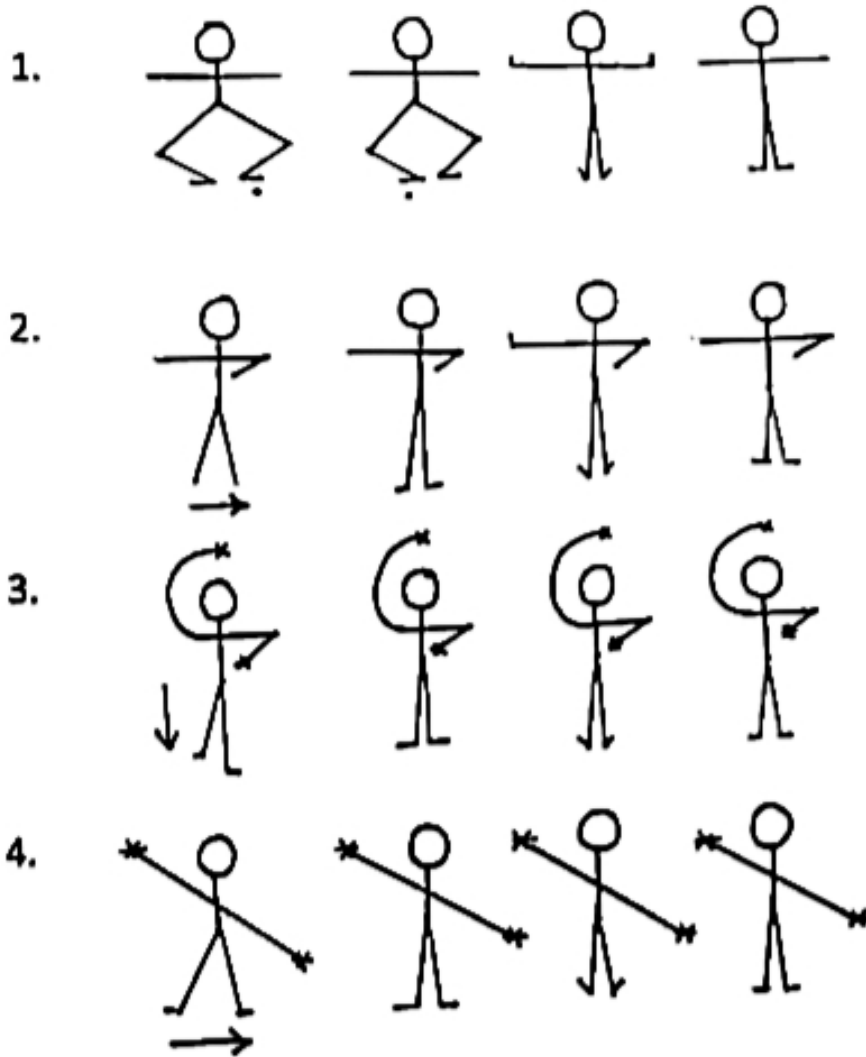
